- Small mammals (chinchillas, guinea pigs, ferrets, rabbits, prairie dogs, sugar gliders)
- Reptiles (lizards, snakes (lizards, snakes, turtles, tortoises)
- Invertebrates (hermit crabs, scorpions, tarantulas).

EMERGENCY CARE & HOSPITALIZATION

Our hospital is available for exotic emergencies by appointment and has a 24-hour monitored critical care unit. Stable patients requiring additional care are hospitalized in a temperature controlled, quiet, exotics only ward.






